What is unusual about your hometown, place of work or job?

"Hopkinton, Mass., is where the Boston Marathon begins. We are located exactly 26 miles from Boston. They are painting the starting line today because the race is next week. It is a big day for our little town of 14,000. For about five hours, 26,000 runners flood our town."

What does this year's theme, "The Power of Unity," mean to you? How has your local benefited from putting unity into action?

"The convention theme "The Power of Unity" means a lot to me. We just settled our contract on April 1, just three hours after it expired at midnight on March 31. Eversource has 9,000 employees now over three states in seven different unions. For me, the power of unity was to work to create a relationship with all of the other unions, to reach out to them and bring us all together. We met and collaborated. Going into bargaining, we were united. As a result, the company was fearful because they knew if they took on my union, they took on all of us."

What issues will be important when your local's contract expires?

"Among the most important issues in that bargaining was contracting out. We were able to maintain awesome language that we had for 40 or 50 years and to get commitments from the company to return some work from contractors."

What's your favorite alternative fact?

"During bargaining, the company would say they cared about employees, but it was not evident in the conversations we had. It was an alternative fact that they cared."
